3. To discuss cases of medical negligence and unethical conduct.

- (i) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3171 of Smt. Chanchal w/o Shri Ajit Singh, r/o, A-119, East Nathu Colony, Main Mandoli Road, Delhi-110093, alleging medical negligence on the part of Dr. Archana Chaudhary and Jyoti Clinic & Nursing Home, B-32, Jyoti Nagar (East), Shahdara, Delhi-110093, in the treatment administered to the complainant and her newborn baby at Jyoti Clinic & Nursing Home, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (ii) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3224 of Smt. Rajwati, r/o- B-148, Gali No.11, Harit Vihar, Burari, Delhi-110084, alleging medical negligence on the part of Dr. Supreeti Gupta of Hindu Rao Hospital, Gandhi Square, Malka Ganj,

Delhi-110007, in the treatment of complainant, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

Kranti w/o Shri Rajender R/o 4/2249, G.No.-3, Bihari Colony Shahdara, allegedly due to medical negligence, on the part of doctors

of Ashok Nursing Home F-3/13-16, Vijay Chowk Krishna Nagar Delhi-51, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

- (viii) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3013 of Shri Prasant Kumar, Special Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Rural Development, Department of Rural Development, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi-110001, alleging professional misconduct on the part of Dr. Usha M. Kumar of Max Smart Super Specialty Hospital, in the treatment of complainant's daughter Smt. Pragya, resulting in her death, was taken confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (ix) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3223 of Shri Vishwa Vijay Tiwari, 1671 Sector 05, R.K. Puram, New Delhi-110022, alleging medical negligence and professional misconduct, on the part of Dr. Anuradha Kapur, Max Smart Super Speciality Hospital, Saket, New Delhi-110017, in the treatment administered to the complainant's wife Smt Meena Tiwari, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (x) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3588 of Shri Satya Prakash Gupta, Chief Editor, Satya Prakash Times, A-71, Shastri Nagar, Delhi-110052, forwarded by the Directorate General of Health Services, Govt of NCT of Delhi, alleging professional misconduct on the part of Dr. Veena Aggarwal, Veena Nursing Home, A-1/3, Sector 08, Rohini, New Delhi-110085, in the treatment administered to complainant's daughter in law Smt. Parul Gupta, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (xi) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3004 of Shri Deepak Saini s/o Shri Mahender Pal, r/o- C-23, Ganga Vihar, Delhi-110094 made to National Human Rights Commission, forwarded by Directorate General of Health Services, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, alleging medical negligence on the part of Dr. Rajnish Sharma of K.K. Surgical Maternity Centre, B-37, East Jyoti Nagar, Delhi-110093, in the treatment of complainant's mother Smt. Prem, resulting in her death on 26.09.2019 at Max Hospital, Vaishali where she subsequently received treatment, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (xii) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3564-a representation from Police Station Aman Vihar, seeking medical opinion in respect of death of Smt. Omwati w/o Shri Azad Singh, forwarded by Delhi Medical Association, allegedly

due to medical negligence on the part of doctors of Cygnus MLS Hospital Main Kanjhawla Road, Rama Vihar, New Delhi-110001, resulting in her death on 24.08.2020 at Shri Balaji Medical Institute Paschim Vihar, Delhi where she was subsequently treated, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

- (xiii) The Order of the Executive Committee in complaint No. 3601- notice of an advertisement published in 'Magna' as per which Dr. Gursimar Singh Kochhar is suffixing M.D. to his name, even though, as per the State Medical Register of the Delhi Medical Council, he is registered with Delhi Medical Council with MBBS and D.C.H qualification; in violation of Regulation 1.4.2 of Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics), Regulations, 2002 which mandates that "*a physician shall display as suffix to his/her names only recognized medical degrees or such certificates / diplomas and memberships/ honours which confer professional knowledge or recognizes any exemplary qualification / achievements.*", was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (xiv) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2532 of Shri Kishore Kumar, R/O- House No. 439, B-4, Block, Bhalswa Dairy, Bhalswa, North West Delhi-110033, forwarded by the Medical Council of India, alleging medical negligence on the part of the doctors of Kapil Multispecialty Hospital, A-1, Shastri Park, Near Joseph & Mary Public Hospital, Nathupura Mor, Burari, Delhi-110084, in the treatment administered to the complainant at Kapil Multispecialty Hospital,, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

The Council also confirmed the punishment of removal of name of Dr. V.P. Singh(Dr. Virendra Pal Singh, Delhi Medical Council Registration No. 11628) for a period of 07 days awarded by the Disciplinary Committee with a direction that he shall undergo 20 hours of C.M.E.(Continuing Medical Education) on the subject "urology" during the period of suspension.

The Council further observed that the Order directing the removal of name from the State Medical Register of Delhi Medical Council shall come into effect after 60 days from the date of the Order.

This observation is to be incorporated in the final Order to be issued. The Order of the Disciplinary Committee stands modified to this extent and the modified Order is confirmed.

- (xv) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2690 of Shri Sunny, s/o Shri Devender Pal, r/o- House No.A-1665, Third Floor, Jahangir Puri, Delhi, alleging medical negligence on the part of Dr. Rishi Jain and Dr. Purnima Jain of Samyak Hospital, BM-7, (East) Shalimar Bagh, Delhi-110088, in the treatment administered of the complainant's wife Smt. Bhanu, resulting in her death, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

The Council further confirmed the punishment of warning awarded by the Disciplinary Committee to Dr. Punima Jain (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.23151), Dr. Rishi Pal Jain (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.15682), Dr. Pankaj Saraswat (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.36846) and Dr. Ayush Kumar Gupta (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.2900).

The Council further observed that the Order directing the issuance of warning shall come into effect after 60 days from the date of the Order.

This observation is to be incorporated in the final Order to be issued. The Order of the Disciplinary Committee stands modified to this extent and the modified Order is confirmed.

- (xvi) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2622 of Shri Dalip Kumar Mam, r/o Flat No. 4B, Bharat Apartment, IP Extension, Patparganj, Delhi forwarded by the Medical Council of India, alleging medical negligence on the part of doctors of Max Hospital, Patparganj, Delhi, in the treatment of complainant's daughter in law Smt. Shilpa Mam, resulting in her death on 20.07.2018, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (xvii) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2577 of Shri Amar Singh Dhanwal, r/o- RZ-G-1/49, Mandir Marg, Mahavir Enclave-I, New Delhi-110045, alleging medical negligence on the part of the doctors of Rockland Hospital (now known as Medeor Hospital), HAF-B, Sector-12, Phase-1, Dwarka, New Delhi, in the

treatment administered to the complainant's wife Smt. Savitri, resulting in her death on 22.08.2018, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

- (xviii) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2518 of Shri Kirpal Singh r/o 100-A, Shivam Enclave, Near Jhilmil Colony, Delhi-110032, forwarded by the Medical Council of India, alleging medical negligence in the treatment administered to the complainant's wife Smt. Nirmal Kaur at Shanti Mukand Hospital, #2, Institutional area, Vikas Marg Extention, Karkardooma, Delhi-110092, resulting in her death on 30.03.2018, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.
- (xix) A complaint No. 2489 of Shri Nand Kishore s/o Late Chiranjivi Lal r/o F-46-B Ground Floor, Gali No. 12, Mangal Bazar, Lakshmi Nagar, Delhi-110092, alleging medical negligence, in the treatment administered to complainant's wife Smt. Manju Rani at Makkar Multi Speciality Hospital, A-1 & 2, Priyadarshini Vihar, Delhi-110092, resulting in her death, was determined by the Disciplinary Committee vide Order dated 06th October, 2022. The Order dated 06th October, 2022 of the Disciplinary Committee was put up to the Delhi Medical Council for confirmation in its meeting held on 19th October, 2022. As per the minutes of the Council dated 19th October, 2022, the Council observed that the matter be referred back to the Disciplinary Committee for re-consideration on the following issues -:
- (a) Which records required to be maintained during the dialysis, be specified, which were not kept in the present case?
 - (b) Whether Dr. Ajeet Kumar Roy had adequate training to manage ICU independently, be looked into by the Disciplinary Committee.

The subsequent Order dated 13th December, 2022 of the Disciplinary Committee after re-consideration, was placed before the Council today i.e. 21st December, 2022 for confirmation.

The Council after due deliberations, confirmed the Orders dated 06th October, 2022 and 13th December, 2022 of the Disciplinary Committee.

The Council further confirmed the punishment of warning awarded by the Disciplinary Committee to Dr. Ajeet Kumar Roy (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.20138) as a Medical Superintendent of Makkar Multi Speciality Hospital

The Council further observed that the Order directing the issuance of warning shall come into effect after 60 days from the date of the Order.

This observation is to be incorporated in the final Order to be issued. The Order of the Disciplinary Committee stands modified to this extent and the modified Order is confirmed.

(xx) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 2632 of Dr. Abhimanyu Pandit, r/- A4, Block-133, Paschim Vihar, Delhi, alleging medical negligence and professional misconduct on the part of Dr. Pramod Sehrawat, Sri Balaji Action Medical Institute, Paschim Vihar, New Delhi, in the treatment administered to complainant's wife Dr. Sony Sohanee, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

(xxi) The Order of the Disciplinary Committee in complaint No. 3362 of Shri Rohit Bhatnagar M-422, Ground Floor, Rishi nagar, Rani Bagh, New Delhi-110034, forwarded by Dy. Commissioner of Police Central District, Delhi, alleging medical negligence on the part of doctors of BLK Hospital, Pusa Road, Delhi, in the treatment of complainant's mother Smt. Archana Bhatnagar, resulting in her death, was confirmed by the Delhi Medical Council.

4. To discuss about the Minutes of the Anti Quackery Committee.

The minutes of the meeting of the Anti-Quackery of the Delhi Medical Council held on 19th December, 2022 (**appended herewith as annexure 'B'**) which were circulated to the members present, were confirmed.

5. To discuss about the Minutes of the Finance Committee.

The Secretary informed that there are no minutes of the Finance Committee of the Delhi Medical Council on which discussion is required, as no meeting of the Finance Committee of the Delhi Medical Council had been convened.

6. Any other item with permission of Chair.

(i) Guidelines on Hair Transplant Procedures.

The Guidelines on Hair Transplant Procedures (which were circulated to the members present, appended herewith as annexure 'C'), were placed before the Delhi Medical Council for consideration.

The President directed that the Guidelines on Hair Transplant Procedures have already been e-mailed to all the Council members. The Council members were requested to mail their comments within next 48 hours, so as to finalize.

(ii) A representation dated 12th December of Dr. Rajesh Kumar.

The Council noted that vide Order No. Order No.DMC/DC/F.14/Comp.1800/2/2016/263554 to 263565 dated 18th July, 2017, in complaint No. 1800, besides awarding warning to Dr. Sanjay Kumar Singh (Delhi Medical Council Registration No.36044) with a direction that Dr. Sanjay Kumar Singh should undergo fifteen hours of Continuing Medical Education (C.M.E.) on the subject Emergency Medical Care, the Delhi Medical Council has also indicted Dr. Rajesh Kumar and directed him to undergo CME. However, since at the time of passing of the aforementioned Order, Dr. Rajesh Kumar did not hold valid registration with Delhi Medical Council, as his name already stood deleted w.e.f. 5th August, 2007 under Delhi Medical Council registration No.15452, on account of non renewal; no punishment in terms of warning or suspension of registration was inflicted on Dr. Rajesh Kumar. Further, in terms of the said Order, the criminal prosecution was initiated against Dr. Rajesh Kumar u/s 15(3) of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, as he was found to have been practising without having valid registration with Delhi Medical Council.

It is noted that subsequently, Dr. Rajesh Kumar had renewed his registration with Delhi Medical Council on 09th August, 2022. In view of the fact that Dr. Rajesh Kumar had renewed his registration with Delhi Medical Council, the Council is of the view that criminal prosecution against him, may be withdrawn. However, since, the Delhi Medical Council in its Order dated 18th July, 2017 has indicted Rajesh Kumar Raj, he may be issued a notice to appear before the Disciplinary Committee and to show cause as to why penalty which includes warning or suspension of registration be

not imposed on him with requirement to undergo CME for his lapses attributed to him in the aforementioned Delhi Medical Council's Order.

(iii) **Order of the Central Information Commission No. Second Appeal No. :-CIC/DMDCL/A/2022/126032-UM dated 28th November, 2022 in the matter titled 'Mr. Rajendra Singh Pawar Versus CPIO, PIO/Nodal Officer (RTI Cell), Delhi Medical Council.**

An Order of the Central Information Commission No. Second Appeal No. :-CIC/DMDCL/A/2022/126032-UM dated 28th November, 2022 in the matter titled 'Mr. Rajendra Singh Pawar Versus CPIO, PIO/Nodal Officer (RTI Cell), Delhi Medical Council, was taken for consideration before the Delhi Medical Council.

On perusal of the aforementioned Order dated 28th November, 2022 of the Central Information Commission, the Council observed that an RTI application dated 11th January, 2022 (**I.D.No.2479**) of the appellant Shri Rajendra Singh Panwar was received in the office of the Delhi Medical Council on 13th January, 2022 wherein the appellant sought the following information:-

1. Please provide the information that M.B.B.S., M.S. (Ortho.)/D.N.B. Ortho. doctor is entitled to report a M.L.C. case x-ray.
2. Please provide qualification of doctor to report a M.L.C. x-ray.
3. Please provide information that C-arm used by an orthopedic surgeon in O.T. requires T.L.D. Card or not.

The aforementioned RTI of Shri Rajendra Pal Singh was disposed by the Public Information Officer vide his letter No.DMC/F.3/RTI/1/2022/302406 dated 18th January, 2022 wherein it was informed the appellant that no such information, as sought by him through his queries is available with the Delhi Medical Council.

Subsequently, a First Appeal dated 07th February, 2022 of the appellant against the decision of the Public Information Officer dated 18th January, 2022—with reference to ID No.2479, was received in the office of the Delhi Medical Council 08th February, 2022 wherein it was requested by the appellant to provide the information in regard to his queries, as mentioned in his RTI application dated 11th January, 2022. Accordingly, the same was disposed by the First Appellate Authority vide his letter

No.DMC/F.3/RTI/ Appeal/1/2022/303907 dated 04th March, 2022 wherein it was noted that the Public Information Officer vide his letter DMC/F.3/RTI/1/2022/302406 dated 18th January, 2022 had informed the appellant that no such information, as sought by him through his queries is available with the Delhi Medical Council.

The Delhi Medical Council further observed that Delhi Medical Council is a Statutory Body, constituted under the Delhi Medical Council Act, 1997 for the maintenance of a Register of medical practitioners who are engaged in the practice of modern scientific system of medicine and all its branches in the NCT of Delhi. The Delhi Medical Council Act, 1997 and the Delhi Medical Council Rules, 2003 framed under the Act are available on the website of the Delhi Medical Council (www.delhimedicalcouncil.org) at _____ (link-
<https://delhimedicalcouncil.org/images/dmcaact.pdf>).

The Delhi Medical Council also observed that in terms of Section 15(3) read with Section 15(6) with the Delhi Medical Council Act, 1997, a person who possess recognized medical qualification as per Schedule First, Second or Third to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and is registered with the Delhi Medical Council as per the Delhi Medical Council Act, 1997, is entitled to practice modern scientific system of medicine (allopathy) in the NCT of Delhi.

The Delhi Medical Council further observed that the Delhi Medical Council Act, 1997 or the Delhi Medical Council Rules, 2003 do not provide information specific to the queries that M.B.B.S., M.S. (Ortho.)/D.N.B. Ortho. doctor is entitled to report a M.L.C. case x-ray; or the qualification of doctor to report a M.L.C., x-ray; or whether C-arm used by an orthopedic surgeon in O.T. requires T.L.D. Card or not. In view of above, no information specific to the queries of the applicant, is available with the Delhi Medical Council.

The aforementioned be communicated to the appellant and the Hon'ble Central Information Commission.

(iv) **Representations of the Temporarily Staff of the Delhi Medical.**

Representations of the temporarily staff of the Delhi Medical Council, seeking regularization of their service with the Delhi Medical Council, were taken up for consideration before the Delhi Medical Council.

On perusal of the aforementioned representations of the temporarily staff of the Delhi Medical Council, the President directed that a five members Committee of the following members be constituted to look into the issue of regularization of temporary staff of the Delhi Medical Council and to revert back to the Council with its recommendations.

- (a) Dr. Naresh Chawla
- (b) Dr. Maneesh Singhal
- (c) Dr. Rakesh Kumar Gupta
- (d) Dr. Manish Narang.
- (e) Dr. Vijay Dhankar

(v) **Requirements of Computer Systems and other Equipments i.e. Printer/Printers, Scanner/Scanners, etc.**

The Registrar informed that most of the computer systems and other equipments i.e. printer/printers, scanner/scanners, etc., as available in the office of the Delhi Medical Council, have become obsolete. Due to which, the computer systems and other equipments rendered, do not cater to the wide requirement of the works of the Council with speedy and smooth, hence, the following computer systems and other equipments are required for the office of the Delhi Medical Council.

In view of the above, the President directed the Registrar to take necessary steps for fulfilling the requirements of the aforementioned items for the office of the Delhi Medical Council from the Kendriya Bhandar.

- (vi) The Registrar informed that details of all the complaints of medical negligence/professional misconduct against a registered medical practitioner received and examined by the Delhi Medical Council year wise, from the year 2000 onwards, is displayed on the Delhi Medical Council's website.

The Registrar further informed that the aforementioned details of the complaint may not be allowed access for general public, as the same may cause unwarranted invasion of the privacy of the individuals; for it contains medical information of personal nature of individuals which otherwise also has no relationship to any public activity or interest and the same are exempted from disclosure under Section 8(i)(j) of the R.T.I. Act.

After lot of deliberations, the Council decided that the present status quo be maintained.

- (vii) **Letter No.U.15024/17/2022-UGMEB/026179 dated 14th July, 2022 from the National Medical Commission.**

The Registrar informed the members present that a letter No.U.15024/17/2022-GMEB/ 026179 dated 14th July, 2022 from the National Medical Commission regarding allotment of internship to Foreign Medical Graduates in medical colleges are publication of CRMI Regulations, 2021 & FMGL Regulations, 2021, was received in the office of the Delhi Medical Council.

As per the aforementioned CRMI Regulations, 2021 & FMGL Regulations, 2021, a meeting was convened by the Delhi Medical Council with Dean/Principal of medical colleges in NCT of Delhi to discuss the issued related to the provision of allocation of Foreign Medical Graduates for internship at various medical colleges in Delhi wherein the following observations have been made :-

- a. Dr Ritu Arora, Dean, Maulana Azad Medical College raised the issue that the college neither has the hostel facility to accommodate the Foreign Medical

Graduates nor Provision in the budget to pay the stipend to external candidates, budgetary approval need to taken from Directorate Medical Education.

- b. Dr. Maj. Gen. Surendra Singh, Dean, Army College of Medical Sciences have informed that Army College of Medical Sciences does not have its own teaching hospital and is affiliated to the Army Base Hospital, Delhi Cantt. Army Hospital is a military hospital and caters to only Army personnel families and dependents and expresses his inability to include the external candidates for Internship until the permission is granted by Ministry of Defence, Govt of India.
- c. Dr Virendra Kumar, Principal, Lady Hardinge Medical College informed that Lady Hardinge Medical College is only a girls medical college at the UG level and can only admit the female candidates forextemship training.
- d. Dr Sanjeev Lalwani, Registrar, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi informed that AIIMS is statutory autonomous body and does not come under the preview of National Medical Commission and to allow the externship to Foreign Medical Graduates is not applicable to All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi.
- e. Dr Prachi Renjhen, Academic Coordinator, Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar Medical College informed that; in the list of approved medical college, available seats for FMGs in Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar Medical College is shown as 134 and annual intake 125, however the annual intake permitted is 100 for ongoing internship batch therefore only 7 Foreign Medical Graduates can be permitted to do internship in Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar Medical College.

Participating members opined that the above mentioned issues should be taken up with National Medical Commission to implement the provision of the regulation to allot seats to Foreign Medical Graduates in medical colleges in Delhi. Further it was also observed that Non Teaching Institutes should be included for Internship as was done earlier, as the medical colleges alone will not able to accommodate all the Foreign Medical Graduates due to limited seats available in Medical Colleges of Delhi

It was further decided that guidelines and criteria will be formulated for purposes of allotment of seats to Foreign Medical Graduates in compliance with National Medical Commission Regulations; once the primary challenges/difficulties; raised hereinabove, in implementing such regulation are addressed. It was also decided that various difficulties/challenges raised herein-above, relating to implementation of CRMI Regulations, be shared with National Medical Commission for its consideration and advisement. Further, till such times all the modalities regarding implementation of CRMI Regulations, 2021 are put in place; all foreign Medical Graduates who are currently undergoing their internship at Institutes/Hospitals recognized by erstwhile Medical Council of India should be considered eligible for seeking registration with Delhi Medical Council on completion of Internship Training, in order to ensure that student interest is not adversely affected.

Accordingly, the following criteria have been formulated for allotment to the Foreign Medical Graduates Students for internship in medical colleges in Delhi.

CRITERIA FOR PREPARING MERIT LIST

Two separate lists will be published according to following criteria:

Merit List 1 (ML1): Candidates who are resident of Delhi (Passport as Address proof) and have completed their (10+2) from CBSE, Delhi or Equivalent Board in Delhi.

Merit List 2 (ML 2): Candidates who are resident of other states Merit list will be prepared based on NBE score of Screening Test Result obtained by the candidate and in case more than one candidate with same score, merit will be determined on the basis of following criteria:-

- a. Candidate who has secured higher percentage in subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology (PCB) marks in (10+2) examinations.

- b. Candidates who has secured higher percentage in subject of Biology marks in 10+2 examinations.
 - c. Candidate who is older.
 - d. The seats will be first allotted to candidates according to Merit List1 & Merit List2 respectively i.e. 5ML1:1ML2 Ratio.
- The candidates who make up the Merit List will be eligible to apply for provisional registration with Delhi Medical Council online; within 7 days from publication of such list.(No need to apply again incase the candidates have already applied or provisionally registered with DMC.)
 - Final List of successful candidates for both candidates who have already applied for provisional registration & candidates who wish to apply in Delhi detailing the respective college allotted for undergoing Internship will be published on Delhi Medical Council website.
 - The selected candidates have to join the internship programme immediately but not later than 7 days from the date on which final list is uploaded on official website of Delhi Medical Council and if candidate is not able to join the allotted medical college/institution within 7 days, the seat will be considered vacant and will be allotted to next eligible candidates as per Merit List, who meet the necessary criteria.
 - Standalone PG institutes imparting DNB training under DNB-PDCET and non-teaching hospitals are not entitled to conduct Compulsory Rotatory Medical Internship after the publication of the Public Notice from National Medical Commission dated 21st September, 2022.
 - The amount of stipend to be paid to the interns is to be decided/fixed by the appropriate authority and is solely at the discretion of the concerned authorities under which the medical college/institute is located and Delhi Medical does not bear any liability in this regards.

Subsequently, the successful candidates have been allotted the seats to undergo their internship in medical college situated in the NCT of Delhi as per list(**Annexure 'C'**).

The Registrar further informed that a Public Notice No.U-15024/196/2022-UGMEB dated 21st September, 2022 issued by the National Medical Commission, was received in the office of the Delhi Medical Council wherein it was mentioned that standalone PG institutes imparting DNB training under DNB-PDCET and non-teaching hospitals are not entitled to conduct Compulsory Rotatory Medical Internship after the public of the NMC's CRMR Regulations, 2021. In response this, a Public Notice No.DMC/Regn./F.11/2/2022/308990 dated 30th September, 2022 was issued by the Delhi Medical Council wherein it mentioned that since at present no such modalities as envisaged in the National Medical Commission Advisory regarding acceptance of internship of Foreign Medical Graduates exists; therefore, till such times the modalities are worked out in consultation with the various medical colleges functioning in Delhi, under the aegis of the GNCT of Delhi, & Dean, faculty of Medical Sciences and other concerned authorities and National Medical Commission, all Foreign Medical Graduates who are currently undergoing Internship at Institutes/Hospitals recognized by erstwhile MCI, shall be eligible for seeking registration with Delhi Medical Council on completion of their compulsory internship. Accordingly, the same were communicated to the National Medical Commission by the Delhi Medical Council vide its letter dated 30th September, 2022.

Subsequently, a letter E File No.U-15024/14/2022-UGMEB 049175 dated 04th November, 2022 was received in the office of the Delhi Medical Council from the National Medical Commission wherein it was requested to withdraw the Public Notice dated 30th September, 2022, as issued by the Delhi Medical Council and again advised to follow the provisions contained in CRMI Regulations, 2021 of the National Medical Commission in letter and spirit. In response to this, a letter dated 16th November, 2022 was sent to the National Medical Commission by the Delhi Medical Council wherein it was intimated that in this scenario that Delhi Medical Council took a decision to issue the Public

Notice (issued on 30th September, 2022) in order to safeguard the interest of such students who had started their internship in such institutions, which had been providing internship earlier also and were recognized by the erstwhile Medical Council of India. Accordingly, the all the foreign medical graduates who are currently undergoing internship at institutes/hospital recognized by the erstwhile Medical Council of India, shall be eligible for seeking registration with the Delhi Medical Council after completion of their internship.
